Heartbreaking news from home strengthens Marta's resolve as she moves to England and eventually to Canada. There, she meets handsome Niclas Waltert, a man just as committed as she to forging a better life in a new place. But nothing has prepared her for the sacrifices she must make for marriage and motherhood as she travels first to the Canadian wilderness and finally to the dusty Central Valley of California to raise her family.

"The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge, but fools despise wisdom and discipline." – Prov. 1:7

How many of these adults do you think are seeking wisdom and not just knowledge? You don't get wisdom from a book. Unless you have been blessed with wisdom beyond your age, it takes time and life experience to develop wisdom. To some extent wisdom is a choice as stated in the above Proverb. RECIPE

COCONUT MACAROONS

- 2/3 cup sweetened condensed milk
- 1 egg white
- 1 1/2 tsp vanilla
- 1/8 tsp salt
- 3 1/2 cups coconut
- 1 egg white

Preheat the oven to 325 degrees. In a medium bowl, combine sweetened condensed milk, egg white, vanilla and salt. Stir until well blended. Add coconut to the mixture. Line baking sheet with wax paper. Drop tablespoonfuls of dough onto baking sheet. Bake for 20 to 25 minutes or until lightly browned.
